## SVdP Service Highlights 2022

- Teal St. Shelter has served 103 residents.
- Five low-income housing complexes with 75 units.
- 1800 lbs. of food (not counting the holidays) were directly distributed.
- Over 360 Thanksgiving Baskets were either delivered or distributed.
- Over 350 children received Christmas gifts through Adopt-A-Family.
- Unsold Thrift Store clothing and household goods are distributed through the Dan Austin Center to 15-20 guests a day.
- Home Visit Teams provided 113 home visits, serving 79 neighbors, and providing over \$30,00 in direct aid.
